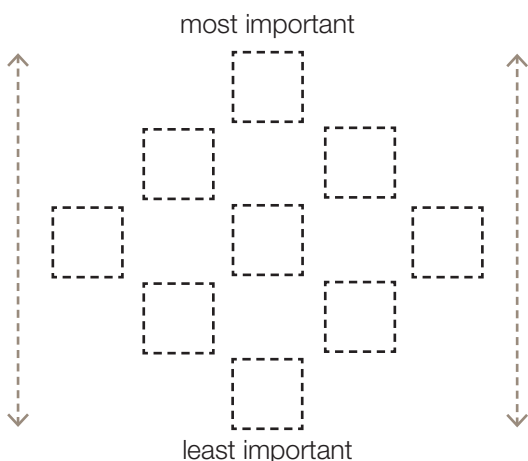


# We have the right
