Every day, millions of women and girls around the world face injustice, violence and discrimination – simply because of their gender. Trapped in a cycle of poverty, they have little or no control over their own lives and are in danger in public, at school, at work and even at home. This needs to change.

What makes us different?

ActionAid works with women and girls living in poverty. We don't impose solutions: instead, we empower local women around the world to lead change and transform lives. We won't stop until women and girls are out of danger, out of poverty and on track to create the future they want.

Our innovative model is based on feminist leadership principles which highlight the value of sharing power. We were the first International Non-Governmental Organisation (INGO) of our size to move our headquarters to the Global South, ensuring that direction is set and decisions are made by colleagues from the countries where ActionAid delivers programmes.

Funding Futures Network (FFN) members are changing the conversation around philanthropy.

They believe the people most affected by poverty, violence and inequality are best placed to decide what support they need. FFN members empower women and girls by allowing us to direct their funds to the areas that women and girls tell us are the highest priority. This localised approach ensures women and girls around the world are leading the change in their communities, resulting in long-term sustainable impact. After all, women and girls know their communities best and have a vision for a better future.

Our approach also means that when disasters strike, ActionAid is ready. The Funding Futures Network enables ActionAid to work hand-in-hand with communities to help them rebuild and recover with women and girls at the heart of those plans via our Emergency Action Fund.

Not only do the FFN members' donations achieve the highest return on investment, but they also enable ActionAid to innovate and invest in essential infrastructure which enhances the quality of our programming and ensures we remain ready to respond to emergencies.

The network meets quarterly, bringing people together from multiple sectors to hear from development experts and philanthropists on topics most critical and relevant for international development.

How can I join?
