## Virtual party game ideas

### The biscuit game

Ask your guests to bring a biscuit to the party and get them to carefully balance this on their forehead by tilting their heads back. The aim of the game is for them to nudge the biscuit from their forehead and into their mouth, without using their hands or the biscuit falling off. The winner is the first to eat the biscuit! Oreos, cookies and digestives work great for this, but make sure everyone has the same biscuit for fairness.

### What footwear am I wearing?

Tell your guests to wear the wackiest footwear they can think of (shoes, slippers, crocs, flippers) and everyone has to guess each other's chosen footwear. The winner is the one whose unusual footwear takes the longest for others to guess.

### How many sweets in the jar?

Bring a jar of counted sweets to your virtual dinner party and ask your guests to guess the number. Award a prize for the closest guess.

### Who's in the baby photo?

Prior to your event, ask your guests to send you a baby photo of themselves. Share these at your dinner party and play Who's Who? You could even throw in some celebrity baby photos.

### Set up a prize fund

Why not ask your guests to contribute towards a prize fund? Play a game of virtual bingo or host a quiz during your dinner party. You could award the winner half of the prize fund and donate the remaining half to ActionAid via your JustGiving page.

### Get creative

Make a model of a famous person, such as the iconic lockdown body coach Joe Wicks, out of toilet paper or food! Everyone votes for a winner, or the host picks the creation that most resembles your chosen celebrity.

### Scavenger hunt

Get your guests active and ask them to search for a list of items as quickly as possible. For example, find an item of food that begins with the letter of your first name. The winner is the fastest to return or the person with the wackiest items!
