In the last few years they've organised Freeze Flash mobs, Human Libraries and other creative campaigning actions for the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-based Violence and other key moments, they have been leading Feminist Leadership projects, they've lobbied their MPs, represented ActionAid at festivals and marches, written posts for our blog, participated to workshops and much more.

Community Campaigners are all different, so they contribute to and develop campaign activities in different ways. **Community Campaigners** develop and contribute to ideas for campaigning activities and turn them into action, they collaboratively organise actions and engage others in campaigning for the rights of women and girls, and they can lead on and participate to ActionAid UK's campaigning activities. Community Campaigners have opportunities to build their **feminist leadership** and to build on their commitment to campaign for **gender equality**.

- It's for everyone from beginners to experts. People from all walks of life and with all (or no) levels of campaigns experience are welcome. We'll give you the support and training you may need, and help you build the skills you need to tackle violence against women and girls.

- Be part of a network of ActionAid activists globally which collaborates to develop and deliver impactful campaigning actions
- Be part of an international campaign to tackle violence against women and girls
- Develop campaigning, communications and organising skills through training
- Engage other people in campaigning for the rights of women and girls
